Entrepreneurial Shark Science Talk

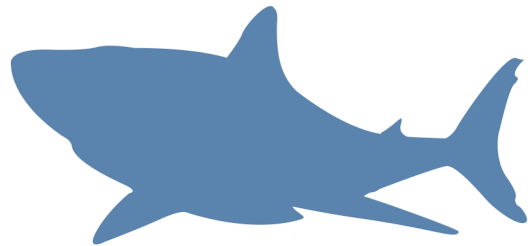

Ocean Practices: OBPS Workshop VI

5 - 19 October 2022

The OBPS Workshop engages the ocean research and applications community in the creation and use of best practices. It draws on the experience of OBPS user groups and stakeholders, provides a place to share this experience, and an opportunity to provide feedback on how the system should evolve to better fulfill the community vision, mission, and needs. The workshop will produce a set of documents on community-specific and general recommendations for community service, OBPS development, and for expanded community engagement.

The program consists of a first Plenary on 5 October to provide background and kick off the Theme Sessions (the Plenaries are broadcast live in two separate Time Zones to allow for global participation). The self-organized Theme Sessions meet at their own schedule during the span of 6-16 October as determined by the Theme Session leads and participants. The second Plenary on 19 October will focus on a workshop-provided summary of the Theme Sessions and their recommendations. These recommendations will be integrated into a multi-year plan. The Community Discussion will cover synthesized Theme Session recommendations, interventions, and answers to questions.

Along the path of our academic journey, we often encounter the exciting prospect of attending a conference. This is soon followed by anxiety and fear of actually preparing a Conference Abstract/Paper from our work. Well, Fear Not!!

Despite this involving planning, reflecting and a slightly “different” style of writing to that of a dissertation/thesis or proposal, **we are here to guide you towards an excellent conference paper.**

In this 2-part interactive workshop, we will journey together through the maze of different conferences and their own regulations/policies. **Together, we will decipher Conference Instructions for Authors and you will actively start preparing and collating your own manuscript.** We will spend time on the basic writing structure as well as the required referencing and formats. We will engage in self-critique and in-house “peer-review” sessions.

The main objective will be to leave you with confidence in your own writing ability and increase that excitement of sharing your paper with the greater academic fraternity

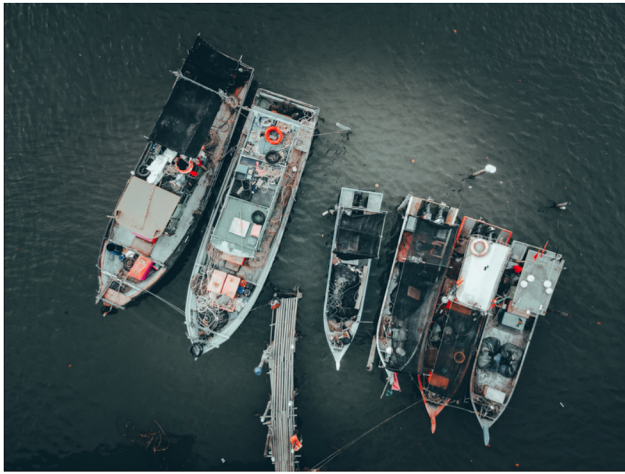

Open Call for Shipboard Fellowship

The Partnership for Observation of the Global Ocean (POGO) offers a [shipboard training fellowship programme](#) which is designed to promote training and capacity development building leading towards a global observation scheme for the ocean. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it is likely that shipboard placements will be made available at shorter notice than normal. In order to make best use of these opportunities, the POGO Secretariat is issuing an Open Call for applications from any early career scientists, technicians, postgraduate students (PhD or MSc) and Post-doctoral Fellows involved in oceanographic work at centres in developing countries and countries with economies in transition.

Workshop on ‘worker voice’ for fishing vessel crews

Event date: 7-8 Nov 2022 | Cape Town

Key Traceability is delighted to inform that we are running a workshop exploring worker voice and grievance mechanisms for fishing vessel crews in Cape Town, South Africa on Monday 7th November / Tuesday 8th November on behalf of Global Seafood Alliance and in collaboration with Woolworths South Africa. The workshop offers the opportunity to discuss what expectations are in terms of worker voice mechanisms and grievance procedures. Standards based on global conventions such as ILO c188 require these mechanisms to be in place, but there is little guidance on what best practice looks like. We are looking to gather people from different parts of the industry to discuss expectations of current best practice – what should be expected on vessels certified to these standards? The workshop forms part of global outreach which involves interviews and workshops. All input is in confidence but will be used to create a report and recommendations. Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program

Closing date: 1 Nov 2022

The [Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program](#) offers opportunities for independent research or study related to Smithsonian collections, facilities, and/or research interests of the Institution and its staff. Fellowships are offered to graduate students, predoctoral students, and postdoctoral researchers to conduct independent research and to utilize the resources of the Institution with members of the Smithsonian professional research staff serving as advisors. These fellowships are offered through the Smithsonian's Office of Academic Appointments and Internships. Fellowship tenures must begin between June 1, 2023 and May 30, 2024.

Determination of the fellowship category for which to apply should be based on the anticipated academic level at the time the fellowship would begin:



Smithsonian

- **Postdoctoral Fellowships** – for scholars up to seven years beyond the Ph.D.*
Term: 3 to 12 months; Stipend: \$55,000 per year; Research Allowance: up to \$5,000
- **Predocutorial Fellowships** – for doctoral candidates to conduct dissertation research. Students enrolled in a university as candidates for the Ph.D. or equivalent are eligible for predoctoral fellowships. Term: 3 to 12 months; Stipend: \$42,000 per year; Research Allowance: up to \$5,000
- **Ten-Week Graduate Student Fellowships** – for graduate students to conduct independent research usually before having been advanced to candidacy if in a Ph.D. program. Term: 10 weeks; Stipend: \$8,000
