# Volunteers Needed: MARiS ECR Committee




# **Chemical Engineering Research Day**

These icy innovators showcased some of their cuttingedge work on the Antarctic sea ice edge. The research encompasses ice-breaking equipment for in situ compression testing, 3D reconstructions of the porosity of ice and digital image processing of desalinating sea ice. ### 2023 Opportunities

#### El Niño 2023 Summit

19 June 2023 | Pretoria

Researchers in South Africa and around the globe have indicated that the regular monitoring of the ENSO system suggests that a strong El Niño is currently developing in 2023. Should this El Niño manifest as projected, we should expect that this will have significant impact on the coming summer climate and weather in southern Africa.

The Extreme Climate Events Research Alliance has called a meeting to share information with affected sectors, businesses, government departments and any stakeholders who seek to understand the basics of the climate predictions, and to consider how this may impact them. We aim to raise awareness of the pending climate anomaly and start the process of gathering information and information requirements in anticipation of its possible impact across the country.



### 4th International Conference on Community Ecology

20-22 Sep 2023 | Trieste, Italy | Abstracts due 15 Jun 2023

The 4th International Conference on Community Ecology (ComEc 2023) will be held in Trieste, Italy, September 20-22, 2023. The ComEc series is a highly international and interdisciplinary scientific environment focused on theoretical and applied advances in all aspects of community ecology.

The scientific focus of ComEc 2023 will be on key aspects of community ecology, including the impacts of global change on biodiversity, the role of species in communities, sustainability and resilience of natural communities to human pressures, insights into innovative solutions for biodiversity monitoring, mapping and analysis, and many other topics. Both students and experienced researchers in the field of community ecology who are studying plant, animal, and/or microbial communities in terrestrial, marine, or freshwater systems are eligible to apply.

#### National Symposium on Biological Invasions 2023

4-6 July 2023 | Houw Hoek Hotel, Grabouw

The Stellenbosch University Centre for Invasion Biology (C·I·B) and the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) are collaborating to host the National Symposium on Biological Invasions 2023. The event will be an in-person event taking place from the 4th to the 6th of July 2023 at the Houw Hoek Hotel. The symposium is open to experts, researchers, students, managers and policymakers currently working on, or with an interest in biological invasions in South Africa.

# Course: Ocean Governance for Africa

4 - 29 September 2023 | Apply by 15 June 2023

Offered by IOI-SA and SANBI, this course aims to meet the ongoing need, within the African region, for training opportunities to enhance capacity and awareness in the various disciplines associated with ocean governance. The course further aims to contribute to building a core of experts on the continent. While the course highlights the importance of the global governance framework, it has a regional focus emphasising the benefits of harmonising ocean policies and a shared, integrated and common approach to ocean management. The course is intended for mid-career professionals. government officials, educators, researchers and civil society members that have coastal and marine related responsibilities, functions or interests, preferably from countries within the African region.

### PhD Studentship at Dalhousie University: CO2 emissions modeling

Estimate carbon dioxide emissions from four urban areas in Canada. This process will involve the interpretation of scientific articles and government documents, tracking down satellite data and the application of skills in remote-sensing and data analysis to generate urban emission models. The ideal candidate will have completed a graduate degree in computer, environmental or atmospheric sciences with a strong technical background in urban remote sensing, carbon sources, and analytics. The appropriate deadline to begin studies is in January or May of 2024.
